



SANTANA RIO NEGRO LODGE – REDD PROJECT

SUMMARY

The Santana Rio Negro Lodge REDD Carbon Credit Project in Amazonas, Brazil is protecting 813,707 hectares in a highly critical region of the Brazilian Amazon. There is a high pressure to deforestation by lack of employers and work, bringing poverty and lack of sustainable growth to it's society. The hotel infrastructure can provide support to sustainable education, to bio researchers and integration with local people in order to improve local sustainable solutions. It has allowed the project to strongly focus on education and infrastructure bringing stability and sustainable initiatives to all the areas that surround the project area by paying for and helping the local residents known as Riverine people to gain work capacity and opportunity. The project also provided entrepreneurs lessons to 300 families with the goal to help further families as carbon credit sales take place. Data Description
